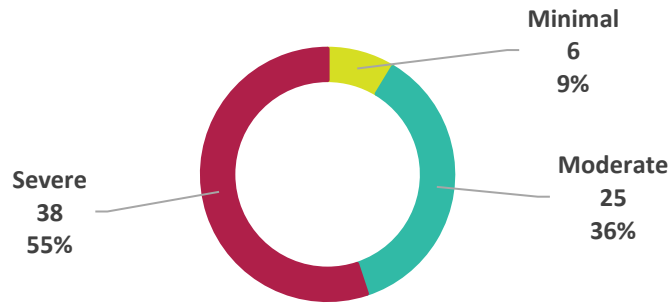


SNAPSHOT OF COVID-19'S IMPACT ON ERIE NONPROFITS

As told by 77 Nonprofits in Northwest Pennsylvania responding to at least one of two surveys conducted by The Nonprofit Partnership (one closing on March 23 and one closing on April 7).

CURRENT LEVEL OF IMPACT

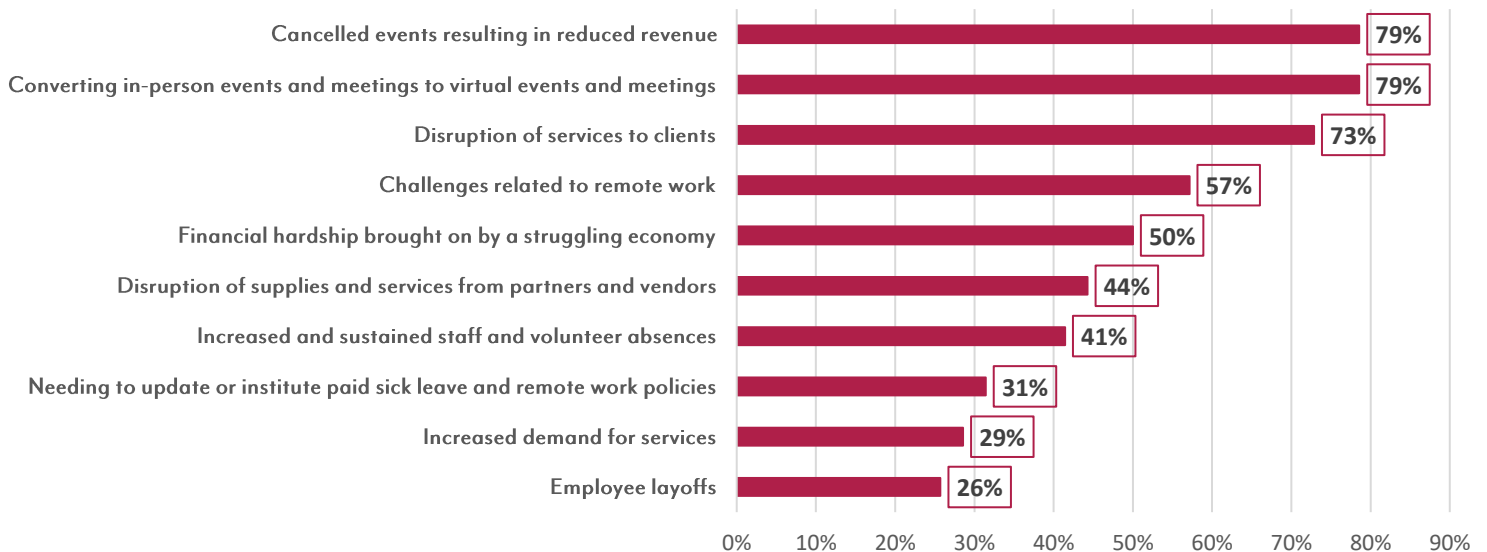
As of April 7, 69 nonprofits reported their current level of impact as noted in Figure 1:



TOP 5 WAYS ERIE NONPROFITS ARE EXPERIENCING IMPACT

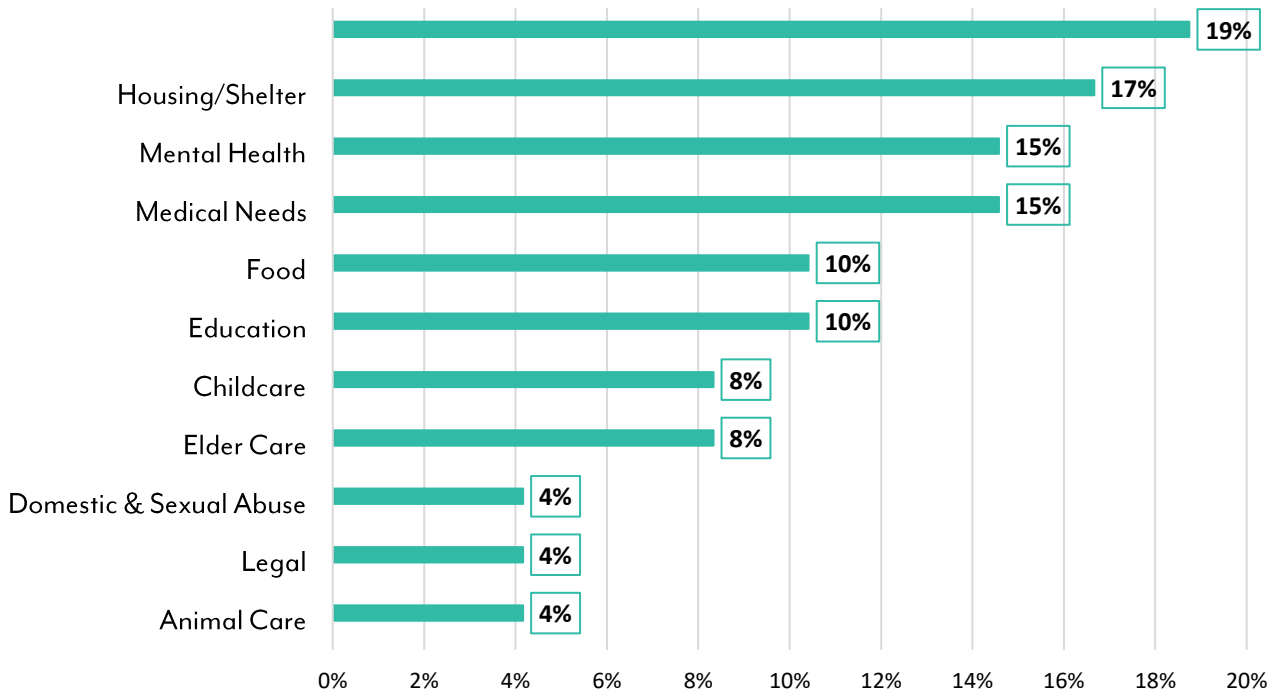
- 79% (55) Cancelled Programs or Events
- 79% (55) Converting in-person events and meetings to virtual events and meetings
- 73% (51) Disrupted Services to Clients
- 66% (40) Challenges Related to Remote Work
- 58% (35) Financial Hardship Brought on by Struggling Economy

ALL IMPACT EXPERIENCED BY REPORTING NONRPOFITS



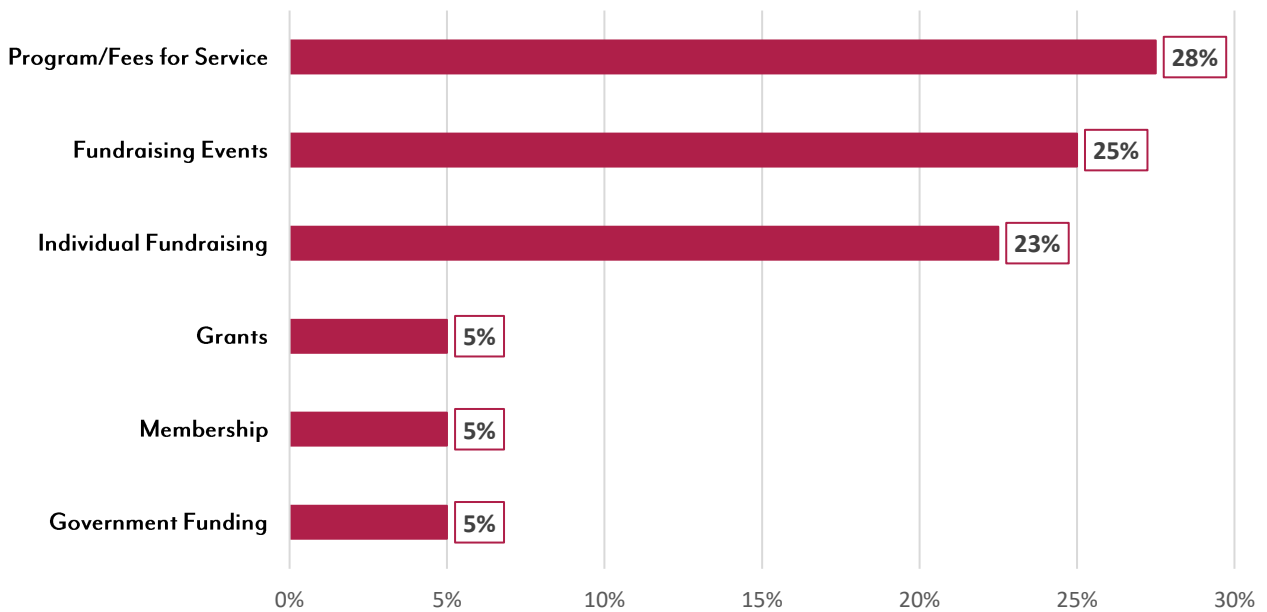
ANTICIPATED CLIENT IMPACT

During the earliest days of COVID-19 response (survey closed on March 23), 47 Erie nonprofits reported the following anticipated client needs:



REVENUE IMPACT

47 nonprofits anticipated decreased revenue resulting from COVID-19. Of the 40 reporting those revenues by type 10% (4) anticipated having to close their doors as a result. Additional financial impact is as follows:



STAFF IMPACT

Of the 70 reporting organizations:

- **21% (15)** reported laying off full-time staff
- **20% (14)** report laying off part-time staff

Table 1 and Table 2 reflects the number of Erie employees impacted by these initial layoffs, with the minimum number impacted totaling **351**.
