2023 ID/A WORKFORCE & SERVICE LANDSCAPE

A COLLAPSING COMMUNITY SERVICE SYSTEM

After years of warning of an impending collapse in the service system for people living with Intellectual Disabilities & Autism (ID/A), advocates and associations across the Commonwealth of PA are reporting new data that paints a dire picture of the situation. Systemic underfunding and the workforce crisis are forcing program closures. Over 12,000 people with disabilities are waiting for services, and more than 4,000 of our most vulnerable citizens are losing current services with no place to go. We must act now; we need \$430M in 2023-2024 state general funds (plus the federal matching dollars this will generate) to enable providers to fund a 20% increase to the average DSP wage, enabling providers and families to compete for workers in the current labor market.
